Raising Income through Skills and Education (RISE) / Training Access Fund (TAF)

This notice covers the processing of personal data by New College Lanarkshire when your course is funded via RISE or TAF.

How we use your personal data

We will use your personal data for the following purposes:

- Assess eligibility for funding.
- Contact you with information/instructions on how to enrol/attend your training.
- Communicate with you prior, during and after your course.
- Request feedback on any courses undertaken.
- To allow the college to claim funding and comply with statutory audit and reporting requirements.

Our lawful basis for using this personal data is **contract** and **public task**. Where we process special category data, our additional lawful basis is **reasons of substantial public interest**, under the Equality Act 2010: DPA 2018, Schedule 1, Part 2 8 (1) – Equality or opportunity of treatment.

Sharing your personal

We will share information on your course attendance and outcome with your employer.

The Raising Income through Skills and Education and Training Access Fund are Scottish Government initiatives managed by the Scottish Funding Council (SFC). To comply with our public task obligations set by the SFC, we are required to share personal data with the SFC as part of our statutory reporting requirements.
